DEFLARCE Visitors Guide OHIO















HISTORICALLY HEADSTRONG

n a word, the history of Defiance County, OH, has always been just that — defiant. Against the slings and arrows of man and the bitter cruelty of nature rose Fort Defiance at the confluence of the Maumee and Auglaize rivers. Constructed by General "Mad" Anthony Wayne, a Founding Father and Senior Officer of the U.S. Army, during the second week of August 1794, it was one of a line of defenses constructed by American forces in the campaign leading to the Northwest Indian War's Battle of Fallen Timbers.

Fort Defiance was considered one of the strongest fortifications in the Ohio Country. When the United States declared war against Great Britain in 1812, General William Henry Harrison constructed a new fort, *Fort Winchester*, near the site of *Old Fort Defiance*, which had been abandoned in 1796. Fort Winchester was used as a staging point and fallback position during the construction of four other forts further north and east of the Fort Defiance location, including *Fort Meigs. Kingsbury Park* is located across the Auglaize River from Old Fort Defiance.







Visitors can experience the history of Defiance County firsthand at *AuGlaize Village*. Open only for special events and tours, this 40-acre park features both original and reproduction buildings with a treasure trove of farming and industrial artifacts — including some hands-on activities — that offer a glimpse of life in Northwest Ohio in the 19th and 20th centuries.

In Downtown Defiance, the *Andrew L. Tuttle Memorial Museum* displays a fabulous collection of artifacts from the history of the community. Located in the historic Home Saving & Loan Co. building, the museum's exhibits include antique coins, Native American artifacts, and military memorabilia. Turn your eyes upward and you'll even see a Simplex airplane on display, paying tribute to the Simplex Aeroplanes corporation that was founded in Defiance in 1928.

The canals that once spurred economic and industrial growth throughout the Midwest still exist in Downtown Defiance — Lock #37 of the Miami and Erie Canal stands at 309 Perry St., while Maumee and Erie Lock #13 is visible via a walking towpath through nearby Independence Dam State Park. These vestiges serve as a reminder of the pioneers and industrialists who built not just Ohio, but America, a continued inspiration for the bold, innovative minds working toward a better future in Defiance to this day.



EXPLORE THE OUTDOORS

iven the confluence of three rivers — the *Maumee*, the *Auglaize*, and the *Tiffin* — the convergence of outdoor recreation in Defiance County is only natural. Boaters, canoers, and kayakers are treated to a prime destination for drifting from one point to the next, while anglers will discover waterways inhabited by trophy walleye, smallmouth bass, and catfish. Opened in 2008, the 74-acre *Defiance Reservoir* contains about 350 million gallons of water with an average depth of 18 feet, offering even more opportunities to spend some time on the water.

The great outdoors in Defiance County extends far beyond those flowing rivers. The vast 591-acre *Independence Dam State Park* offers trails, camping, and picnic areas along with fishing and boating; history buffs can also follow along the 3-mile towpath of the *Miami and Erie and Wabash and Erie Canals* with *Lock #13* serving as a vestige of the famed waterways. *Oxbow Lake and Wildlife Area* features hunting and hiking across the slightly rolling terrain. Birders will discover an area bustling with migrating shorebirds, songbirds, and bluebirds. The 250-acre *Thoreau Wildlife Preserve* features four nature trails highlighting numerous ecosystems characteristic of Northwest Ohio, including wetlands, prairies, hardwood forests, and old growth forests.












Stop and relax. With a variety of amenities at each location, Defiance County's world-class parks system can accommodate with recreation — and relaxation — for all ages! Beat the summer heat at the *Defiance Splash Park at Bronson Park* or at *Kingsbury Park & Pool*. Foster your children's imaginations at the Kids Creation Playground at Diehl Park. Take a break under the Victorian gazebo in *Holgate Park* or by the *Zonta Fountain at Pontiac Metro Park*. And beyond the Defiance city limits, *Little Reservation Station Park* and *Moats Park* in Sherwood offer plenty of opportunities to play and relax. *Hicksville Community Park* — with a brand-new splash pad coming in 2024 — and *Ney Community Park* and *Splash Pad* provide a much-needed break from the summer sun.

Defiance Reservoir & Walking Trails

The Reservoir Nature Trail is an 8-foot wide, multi-use trail extending from the Defiance Reservoir parking lot through approximately 2,500 feet of natural wooded area, offering opportunities for bird watching, leaf-peeping, or enjoying quiet walks through nature. The "upper" trail is a 1.25-mile stone walkway around the top of the reservoir that provides unobstructed views of the reservoir and occasional waterfowl. The Reservoir trails connect to the *Buckeye Trail*, which in turn connects Defiance to the scenic, eight-state *North Country Trail*.

Thoreau Wildlife Reserve

Thoreau Wildlife Reserve features four nature trails that highlight meadows, woodlands, wetlands, and old growth forest. The reserve covers about 250 acres with 2 miles of trails. Numerous signs can be found along the trails with reference to the thoughts of H.D. Thoreau, who inspired the Reserve.

Oxbow Lake & Wildlife Area

The Oxbow Lake Wildlife Area is situated in the glaciated lake plain of Ohio and has a slightly rolling topography. Some steep land lies adjacent to *Mud Creek*, which bisects the area. Large cottonwoods and sycamores are found along Mud Creek. The upland woods consist mostly of oaks and hickories. Migrating shorebirds and songbirds can be observed utilizing the lake edges and woodlots during spring and fall.

Maumee Water Trail

The Maumee River travels through woodland, farmland, and the heart of Defiance en route to Maumee Bay in Lake Erie. Boat, canoe, or kayak from Fort Wayne to Toledo. Download a map at visitdefianceohio.com/explore/trails.

Independence Dam State Park

Independence Dam State Park is located approximately 3 miles east of Defiance on OH-424 and features a hiking trail, once the towpath for the *Miami-Erie and Wabash-Erie canals*, meandering between the old canal path and the river for 3 miles before ending in Florida, OH. In addition to hiking opportunities, Independence Dam State Park provides plenty of opportunities for boating, kayaking, canoeing, and fishing on the *Maumee River* with no horsepower limits. Common fish species include smallmouth bass, northern pike, crappie, catfish, and walleye.

Buckeye Trail

The Buckeye Trail is a 1,444-mile hiking and long-distance trail that loops around the state of Ohio from Cleveland to Cincinnati. The Buckeye Trail Association maintains and develops the trail. In 2017, the Buckeye Trail Association named Defiance an official Buckeye Trail Town. The trail enters Defiance at the Defiance Reservoir, travels along the south end of town and Downtown, across the Old Fort Grounds, and across the Maumee River to Pontiac Park, from which point it heads east out of town. The trail is marked by the Blue Blazes, markings on trees or poles signifying the trail's shape and direction.

North Country National Scenic Trail

The longest in the National Trails System, the North Country National Scenic Trail stretches 4,600 miles across eight states. From North Dakota, the trail continues eastward and joins the Buckeye Trail through parts of Ohio (including Defiance) and continues to Vermont.

LOCAL MASTERPIECES

he show goes on in Defiance County — our communities revel in live music and entertainment on stages that have stood for generations, inviting audiences to enjoy captivating performances just as countless others have before them. Here, the landmark buildings that defined our cityscapes years ago serve as centers for the arts today.



The Tingle Queen of Defiance

Evelyn Ryan established herself as a literary master in the 1950s. Her wit and erudition proved resourceful as the contest winnings from her clever jingles helped support her family. Her story was captured in the 2001 memoir "The Prize Winner of Defiance, Ohio" by her daughter, Terry Ryan, and was adapted into a film in 2005.









For example, visit the **Defiance Community Auditorium**. Originally constructed in 1920 as part of Defiance High School, this historic venue now hosts various musical and theatrical performances throughout the year, including those by the **Fort Defiance Players**. Another venue, the **Stroede Center for the Arts**, was built in 1846 as the First Baptist Church with then-Gov. William McKinley on hand as the cornerstone was laid. Donated to the Defiance Community Cultural Council in 2007, the building has since provided Defiance County with professional video, lighting, and sound, making it an ideal location for regular events like the **Tuttle's Town and Gown Series**, performances by the **Young People's Theatre Guild**, and **The Stroede Center for the Arts Concert Series**, as well as recitals, weddings, and presentations.

In Hicksville, the *Huber Opera House and Civic*Center — originally Mackey's Brick Hotel — was built in 1895 and became a tryout theater for larger theaters in New York and Chicago that were owned by the Opera House's namesake, George H. Huber. After being restored and reopened in 1999, the Huber Opera House boasts an intimate seating capacity of 800 people and is used for a variety of community events and attractions, including its in-house theater troupe, the *Hicksville Village Players*.

The arts are more than just a pastime for spectators in Defiance County. Enrich your creativity at *Just Be Original*

Hicksville native, successful actress-producer, and Broadway star Amelia Bingham

Fine Arts Academy. Located inside Northtowne Mall, JBO encourages aspiring artists to "Just Be You" with classes for all ages, plus space for private parties and a retail store, JBOutique, where visitors can pick out local, handcrafted masterpieces of Defiance made by local artisans.

handcrafted meals paired with refreshing, locally brewed libations on a broad menu suitable for all palates.

Set amid the fairways of Eagle Rock
Golf Club, The Compound offers
dining options that go well with a day
spent relaxing on the greens. Dig into
meals sourced from local farmers
at Sweetwater Chophouse, including
prime, Black Angus steak and ribs
dubbed the "Best Racks in Town."
Grab a slice of Italy at Fired Stone
Tavern, featuring wood-fired pizzas
alongside an extensive burger menu.
Finally, wash it all down at 4KD Crick
Brewery, which features a vast menu
of locally brewed beverages.

In Downtown Defiance, diners and eateries fill historic storefronts with incredible flavors. Since 1928, *Kissner's* has served rib-sticking comfort food and crafty cocktails. *Bud's Restaurant* serves classic, homestyle fare in a vintage diner setting — try one of their pies! Speaking of sweets, *Meek's Pastry Shop* has proudly served donuts, cookies, and cakes since 1925.

Beyond the Defiance city limits, *Iron Horse Brews* offers smoky and tangy
BBQ and other Americana-style dishes
paired with a wide menu of beers,
wines, and spirits. *Two Bandits Brewing Co.* serves up pub classics like Bavarian
pretzels, burgers, and fish 'n chips
alongside creations like the Canadian
Cardiac Arrest, Cajun Gator Bites,
and Elk Meatloaf.







Libation Exploration

Raise a toast to Defiance! The Defiance Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) is a designated public area where alcoholic beverages can be purchased in a designated cup from permitted establishments and carried within the district. The DORA covers 96 acres of downtown Defiance with the southernmost boundary along Davidson Street.

Rules to Enjoy:

- establishment and request your favorite beer or cocktail in a DORA cup. The DORA operates from noon to midnight Monday through Saturday.
- 2. EXIT onto the sidewalks of Downtown Defiance. Beverages must be purchased in DORA cups to leave an establishment and cups must stay within the boundaries indicated by DORA signs.
- 3. ENJOY your beverages while strolling through Downtown Defiance and at any participating merchant with the green DORA decal.
- 4. DISPOSE of your DORA cup when empty. DORA cups are one-time use and must be thrown away prior to entering ANY permitted establishment (i.e., business that holds a liquor license) OR any business with the red DORA decal.
- **5. REPEAT!** Drink responsibly and have fun!





Education
